- Following a significant amount of time and personal commitment as the Chair of the Insurtech Board, Will Thorne has decided to stand down as the Chair. He will remain a member of the Board, Tech Nation wants to again put on record its sincere thanks to Will for his efforts
- Following consultation with the FDP Chair, Deputy Chair and Will as well as the Insurtech Board, Ed Leon Klinger, CEO of Flock, has been appointed as interim Chair until April 2020

Refresh of priorities:

- Will and Ed convened the Insurtech Board for a review of current initiatives and a reorientation towards a 'sprint' to the end of March looking to focus on the value add that a cross-sector group can achieve in that time period
- The group was updated that the Hiscox secondment pilot had hit challenges with Insurtech UK and that with Hiscox's representation Lidia leaving the Board this should be deprioritised by the Board
- The group is looking to identify two objectives that it wants to further explore, potentially including principles and guidelines around insurance strategic investor best practice, and a cross-sector response to the FCA's consultation into Open Insurance
